NSF allocates **94 percent** of its approximately **\$8.5 billion budget** for grants and awards to support research projects, facilities, and Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) education.



NSF funds research in **all 50 states and U.S. territories.**



NSF fosters **international scientific collaboration on all 7 continents** around the globe.



About **2,000 academic and other private and public institutions** across the U.S. conduct **NSF-funded research.**



NSF supports **24 percent of all federally funded academic fundamental research** at U.S. colleges and universities.

What can you see on the external Dashboard?

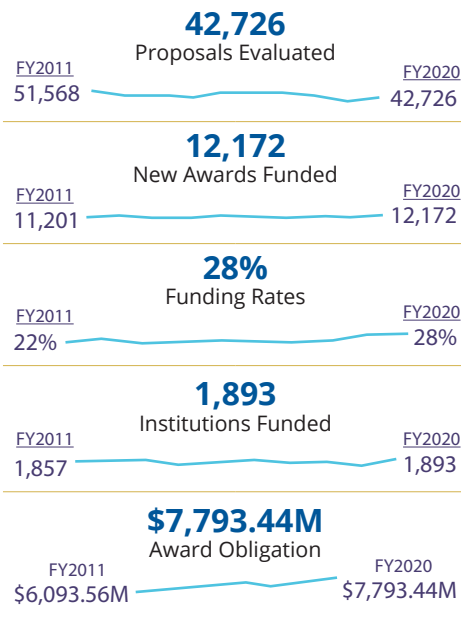

Included in the **NSF By the Numbers Dashboard** are:

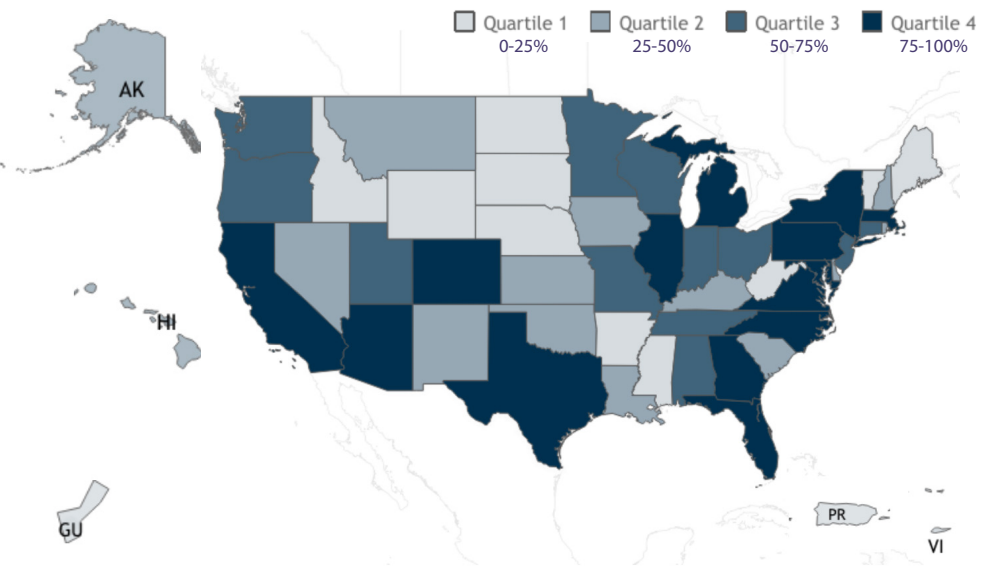
Counts of Awards Funded, Institutions Funded, Funding Rates, Proposals Evaluated, and Award Obligations.

Also included are graphs and other visuals displaying:

- A 10-year view based on FY2011 – FY2020 for all measures;
- A geographical map which allows toggle between map view and bar graph view of States, Congressional Districts, and Institutions, and provides Award details for each Institution;
- Metrics at the selected Directorate level;
- Detailed reports for Awards; and
- Trendline comparisons for all metrics.
